If you know which print you'd like, this is how you order:

Tell me the name and number of the print

- 1) **Tell me your payment choice**
- 2) **Tell me your address**
- 3) **Tell me your postage choice**
(first/second/special delivery or if you're outside the UK)

And I'll take care of everything else.

1 Print sizes:

- Square prints are 19cm by 19cm. Mounts are 30cm by 30cm (12" by 12").
- Rectangular prints have a long edge of 30.5cm (widths vary). Mounts are 30cm by 45cm (12" by 18"). For bigger prints, please see my pdf of '[larger giclee prints](#)'.

- Paypal – I will email you an invoice to pay securely online.

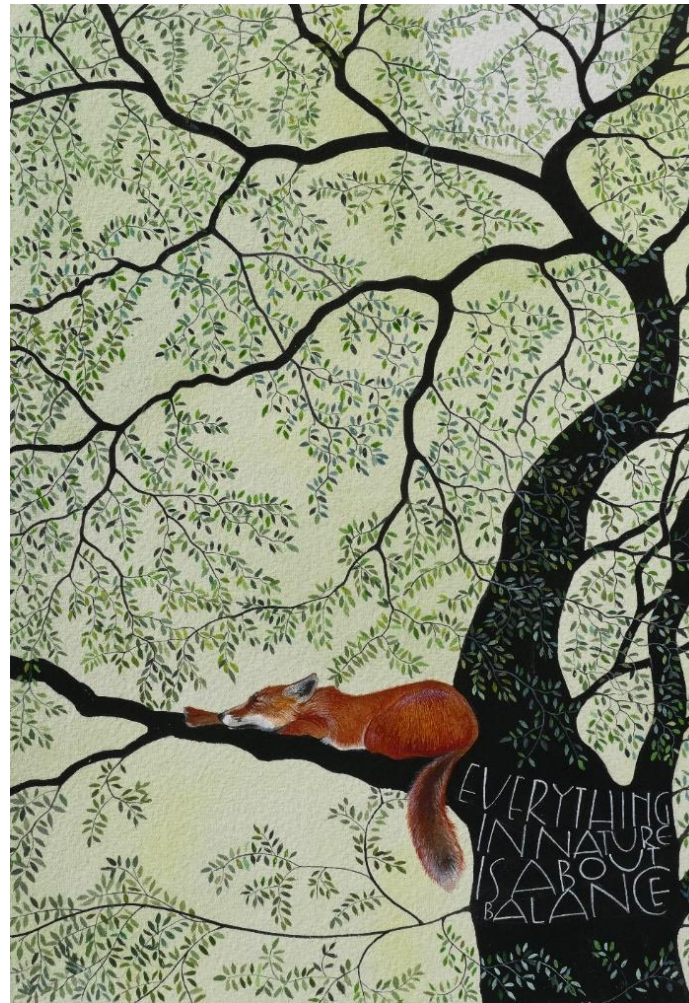

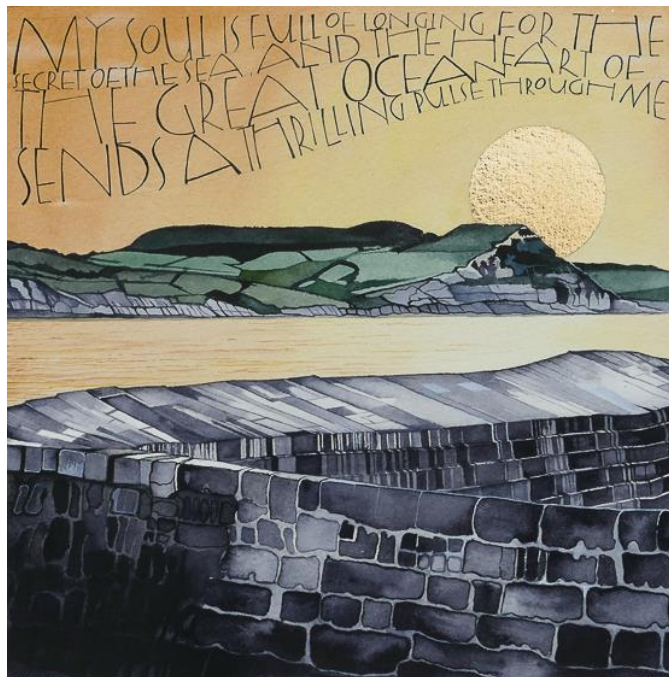

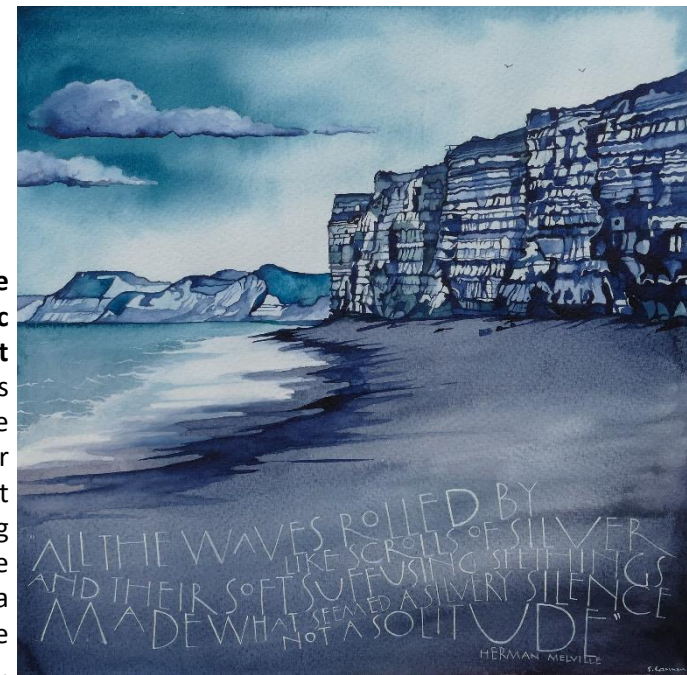
