- Square prints are 19 cm by 19 cm . Mounts are 30 cm by 30 cm ( $12^{\prime \prime}$ by $12^{\prime \prime}$ ).
- Rectangular prints have a long edge of 30.5 cm (widths vary). Mounts are 30 cm by 45 cm (12" by 18 "). For bigger prints, please see my pdf of 'larger giclee prints'.
